



## FOSTER AGREEMENT

FOSTER AGREEMENT AND SIGNATURE	
<input type="checkbox"/>	All animal(s) in foster homes are the custody of PAWS for Life.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Foster volunteers will surrender any foster animal(s) in their care when requested. PAWS may remove animals at their discretion. For example, if an animal is injured or becomes ill due to negligence, or if an animal(s) requires a caretaker with additional experience, we may remove the animal to place it in another foster home. Only the Shelter Manager can approve the moving of an animal from one foster to another.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Fostered animals must be kept separate from other animals in your home. Kittens and Puppies can carry hidden viruses, which your own animals (particularly those under 3 years of age) may contract from contact with them. Do not allow foster cats or kittens to share litter boxes with your cats, and do not share a litter box scoop. When dealing with puppies it is important to clean up their feces and urine immediately whether inside or outside.
<input type="checkbox"/>	I understand and acknowledge that I do not have any right or authority to keep or place foster animals in other homes or with other individuals. If someone is interested in adopting your foster animal, you must notify PAWS and have the person follow the standard adoption process with PAWS. Foster caregivers cannot collect the adoption fees or process the adoption on behalf of PAWS
<input type="checkbox"/>	All Veterinary care will be provided by the PAWS for Life, through the shelter veterinarian. PAWS will cover the costs of the following medical treatments: spay/neuter surgery, deworming, and vaccinations. Any other treatment which includes emergency treatment, must be pre-approved by the Shelter Manager or another member of the shelter management. PAWS is not financially responsible for any bills from other veterinarians that are not approved by the Shelter Manager. Unapproved veterinarian visits will be grounds for removal from the foster program
<input type="checkbox"/>	All veterinary care will be scheduled by a designated employee of the shelter and foster volunteers will be kept informed of when medical care is required.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Foster volunteers agree to follow the advice of the veterinarian, Feline/Canine Care Coordinator, when caring for foster animal(s).
<input type="checkbox"/>	Foster animal(s) must always remain at the dwelling of the foster volunteer except for transportation to and from the shelter or veterinary clinic.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Foster volunteers will give the Feline/Canine Care Coordinator as much notice as possible, not less than 24 hours, if circumstances change and they need to have the foster animal(s) relocated to another foster home.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Foster volunteers may purchase items for foster animal(s); however, they will not be reimbursed for these items unless prior approval to purchase these items was received by the Feline/Canine Care Coordinator.
<input type="checkbox"/>	I agree to hold PAWS for Life harmless from any direct or consequential damages arising out of this foster care arrangement.
<input type="checkbox"/>	If you decide to adopt an animal in your care, you must follow the standard PAWS adoption process. Adoption fees still apply to foster volunteers who choose to adopt. You may not adopt PAWS animal(s) and then re-adopt them to third parties or have a third party adopt a PAWS animal to be placed back in your home.
<input type="checkbox"/>	I agree to follow and comply with all local animal laws and ordinances and PACFA regulations. (A copy of the PACFA may be obtained in the PAWS for Life office.)
